#### College Scholarship Program

The scholarship fund is named in honor of Mrs. Barbara Beazley who founded the organization and is a tribute to her lifelong commitment to helping children in Columbia County. Scholarships are renewable.

CCFFC awards need based educational scholarships to qualified applicants up to age 22, for academic or technical training beyond high school. Scholarships are need based and awarded based on an applicant's financial need, supported documentation of family hardship, career goals, written recommendation, and a personal interview. Applications for the 2017-2018 academic year will be available in early 2017.



We had some wonderful candidates this year, all who are working very hard towards their educational goals. Our candidates represented all five of our local high schools. There were 19 scholarships awarded, totaling \$35,000. Scholarship recipients will be attending: Augusta University, Georgia Southern University, Georgia Southwestern University, Mercer University, University of Georgia and Armstrong State University. We are very proud of our recipients this year.

CCFFC operates the Helping Hands Thrift Store. Family clothing is provided free of charge to Columbia County residents in need who are referred by the Department of Family and Children Services, schools, or churches. Other items may be available on request.

The store is open to the public for low cost clothing and household goods purchases. Donations of new and slightly used family clothing, furniture and household items are welcomed. Tax-deductible receipts are available. Proceeds from the store support the CCFFC Scholarship and Benevolence programs. Through our referral program, the thrift store assisted 104 referrals with a total of 294 members
