College Scholarship Program

The scholarship fund is named in honor of Mrs. Barbara Beazley who founded the organization and is a tribute to her lifelong commitment to helping children in Columbia County. Recipients may reapply annually for renewal of the scholarship.

This year we received 18 renewal scholarships from previous recipients and 19 new applications. The foundation awarded a total of \$48,500 in scholarships. Of the 19 new applications we received: 3 were recent Evans High School Graduates, 5 were recent Grovetown High School Graduates, 3 were recent Harlem High School Graduates (one CTAE scholarship and two BCB Scholarships) and 4 were recent Lakeside. The students are attending UGA, Mercer, Ga Southern, Ga State, Armstrong State, West Georgia College, Augusta University, Augusta Tech, and Oxford College of Emory. We wish them all the best.

Barbara C. Beazley recognized the need in the county to assist disadvantaged children and started the Christmas Program many years ago. During the Christmas holidays, children of families referred by the Columbia County school system and social service agencies are sponsored for holiday gifts. Local schools, businesses, churches and families donate Christmas gifts to include clothing, toys, shoes, school supplies and various other items to bring joy and comfort to these families during the holidays.

Thru the generosity of community sponsors the Foundation coordinated assistance for 216 families (707 children) in 2016. The Foundation sponsored 19 children.

Helping Hands Thrift Store We are Accepting Donations

CCFFC operates the Helping Hands Thrift Store. Family clothing is provided free of charge to Columbia County residents in need who are referred by the Department of Family and Children Services, schools, or churches. Other items may be available on request.



The store is open to the public for low cost clothing and household goods purchases. Donations of new and slightly used family clothing, furniture and household items are welcomed.

Tax-deductible receipts are available.

Proceeds from the store support the CCFFC Scholarship and Benevolence programs. Through our referral program, the thrift store assisted 89 referrals with a total of 248 members in 2016.

Pantry Project

Did you know that 12% of residents of Columbia County live in poverty? While this is below the state average of 17%, the number of children living in poverty in Columbia County is 4,163. This number has been steadily increasing since 2011. This past school year, the Columbia County Foundation for Children implemented a new project in Columbia County high schools and middle schools that we call the "Pantry Project". We hope to roll out the program to elementary schools over the coming months. The main idea behind the Pantry Project is to provide schools with hygiene items to keep in a "pantry" so they have them

when their students need them. The program has been well received and well utilized, especially in the middle schools. We attempt to get items that are small enough in size that students may slip them in their backpacks. Some



of the most requested items have been: acne wash, baby wipes, hair brushes & combs, deodorant, feminine wipes, laundry soap, sanitary napkins, toothbrushes, etc. We have been fortunate that many members of the community have donated funds as well as needed items for the pantry project.
