2022 Spring Greetings from the Columbia County Foundation for Children

As we begin our twenty eighth year providing services for the children of Columbia County, Georgia, we find a much different environment than previous years. There is not one person that hasn't been affected by the pandemic in some way. The pandemic has not affected the services we provide but we have seen less of an income stream from our resource center/thrift store due to limiting donations and hours for covid-19 prevention. We have also seen less identification of children's needs. The board members are open to suggestions as to extend our reach in identifying those children in need. Even though the pandemic has changed our environment, some things have not changed. In 2021, our scholarship program awarded 19,500 in scholarships, our pantry project distributed 731 pairs of underwear, and our Christmas program helped 235 families and a total of 676 children in addition to many other things. We are committed to identifying the needs of children in our area and doing our best to meet those needs. We thank all of the individuals and local businesses and organizations such as Willow Wood Garden Club, Club Car, and The Cleveland Group who are continual supporters of our organization that help further our mission.

Pantry Project

One of the primary goals of the Foundation is to help fulfill the physical and emotional needs of children who are subject to disadvantages beyond their control. Our Pantry Project was started a few years ago to help fill the hygiene needs of children and teens because these items are not available to be purchased with food stamps. The program was started in the high schools and then extended to the middle school and elementary schools. Pre-pandemic there were many more needs identified than post-pandemic, but in 2021 we still distributed 731 pairs of underwear and 118 bars of deodorant. Underwear and deodorant have always been the most requested Pantry items since the inception of the program. Socks and feminine products are close behind as we distributed 84 pairs of socks and 45 packages of sanitary napkins in 2021. A few examples of other items distributed were toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, washcloths, acne wash, shampoo, combs, hairbrushes, and hair ties. Many of the items we distribute from the pantry project were donated by individuals and different organizations (such as Willow Wood Garden Club and Wesley United Methodist Women's Group). If you would like to donate pantry project items such as new/unused underwear, deodorant, socks, soap, feminine hygiene products, etc. to the Foundation, they can be dropped off or sent to 7009 Evans Town Center Blvd, Evans, GA 30809 or 625 Blue Ridge Drive, Evans, GA 30809.

A Word from Katie Cooper 2013 - 2017 Scholarship Recipient



My name is Katie Cooper, and I am an alumna of the Barbara C. Beazley Memorial Scholarship Program, earning the award from 2013-2017. As a high school senior, my grandmother encouraged me to apply for as many

scholarships as possible, and I was driven to alleviate some of the cost of my education. I found the original application process to be very straightforward, with information that was typical for scholarships and an essay that wrote itself about my history and need for the scholarship. I felt prepared to submit my application because the inform I sent in all pertinent information in a manila envelope, and I remember feeling proud when I dropped off that envelope to their office for review.

I wish someone had shared with me how much local scholarships could add up. Sometimes when I was applying for scholarships, I would look for the ones with the greatest funds, but I was often competing with hundreds or thousands of applicants from across the country. 
